Be Born In Us Today

“O Holy Child of Bethlehem! Descend to us we pray. Cast out our sin and enter in; Be born in us today.”

We are told in Luke 1:26, that God sent the angel Gabriel “to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David.”

Her name was Mary. That’s all we know about her. God’s messenger came to one who was in herself insignificant and unremarkable. He announced His gracious purpose to her.

“You have found favor with God,” he said, “The Messiah will be born through you. He will occupy the throne of David forever. You are to give Him the name Jesus.”

Just as Christ came clothed in human form, conceived by the Holy Spirit, He is supernaturally born in us by the same Spirit. As Paul says in Colossians; Christ in us in all His divine nature is our only hope of glory.

Are you facing impossible situations?

- Family crises or broken relationships?
- Difficult circumstances or devastating loss?
- Disappointments, failure or fear of the future?

As the angel said to Mary, “Nothing is impossible with God.”

How much can Jesus do through you and through me? He is limited only by our availability to Him. Ours is simply the response of faith that says with Mary, “I am the Lord’s servant. Let it be done to me according to Your Word.”

I ask You, Lord Jesus Christ, to live Your life of righteousness and grace through me.

Speak through my lips.
Work with my hands.
Be for me what I am not.
Do through me what I cannot.
Your will be done.

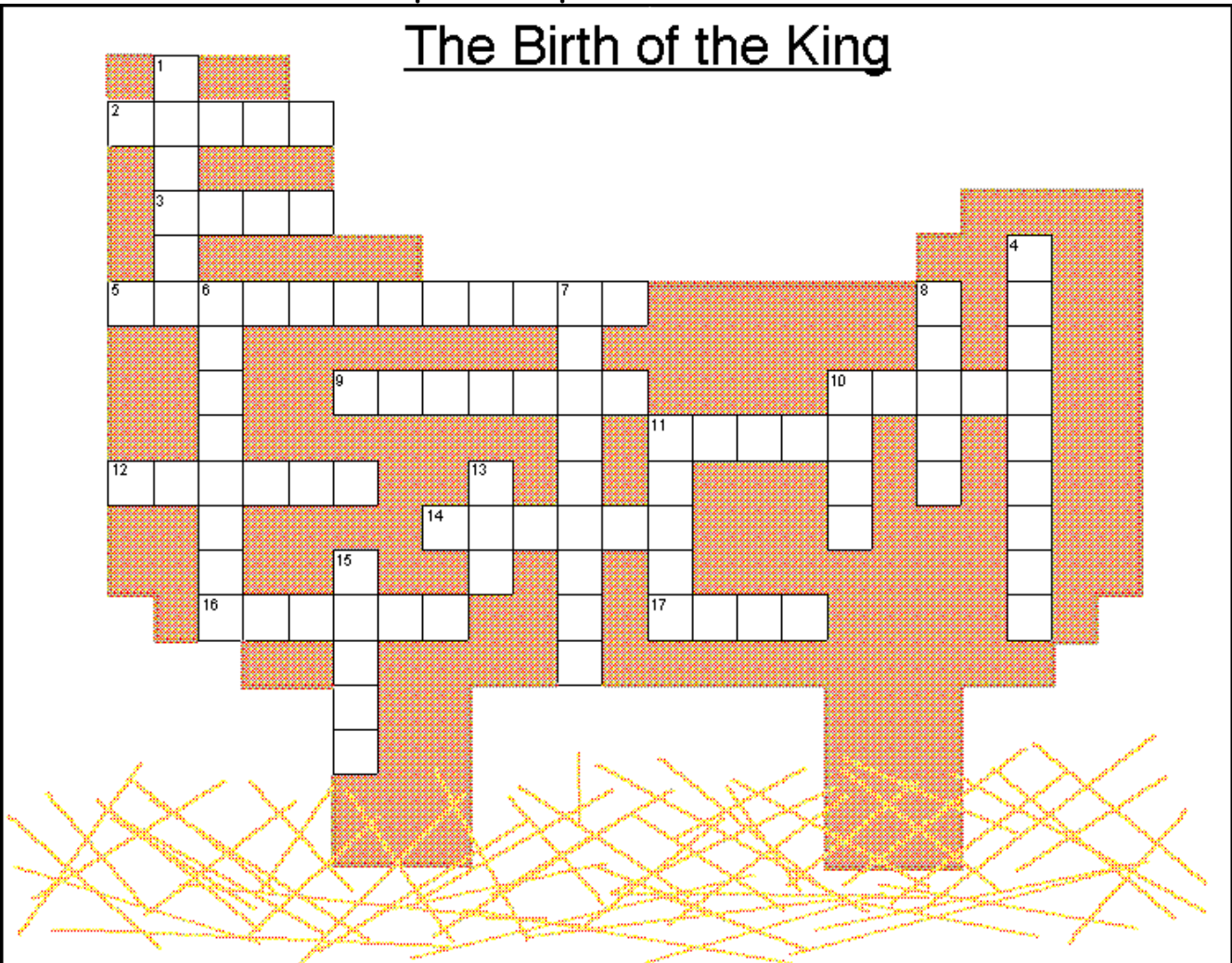
