

New Camp Projects Underway!

In case you missed this news in December, The Bible Camp Board meeting was held November 12, 2012, during which some exciting decisions were made. Two major projects will be funded. The first is to upgrade the playground equipment and the second is to begin upgrading the electrical around camp. There is a committee called the "Site Planning Committee" and they are to get in contact with an electrician to do an assessment of camp. Once the assessment is done we can decide on phases for the upgrade. As funds are collected, upgrades will begin. It was decided that both projects will be started off with seed money from the Bible Camp budget and funds will continue to be collected without end until both projects are complete.

Donations may be made specifically to these projects. Please designate where you would like your donations to be applied. Camp ministry, operations and maintenance continue to be of primary importance and will continue to be a separate fund to which donations may be allocated.
