News from the ELBC Board:

The board has approved the purchase and construction of a new cabin at ELBC. We had a generous donation from a previous user of the camp. We decided to match the funds and begin the building process. Our goal is to build and hopefully use the cabin this year. The new location of the cabin should allow us to either use it as a girls dorm, boys dorm or a family cabin. The plan is to have a wall on the inside that would allow us to close it off and offer flexibility in terms of how it gets used should

the need arise to use it for families or speakers.

2. The board has also set a goal to seek donations to purchase new playground equipment. We have \$10,000 already and have a goal of \$30,000. We realize this seems like a lot of money however that is the cost of commercial grade, maintenance free and CSA approved playground equipment. We also wish to beautify the playground area with some new benches, picnic tables and trees. A site plan will be developed and we will update the website with a picture so that everyone can get an idea of what the proposed area will look like. This year we hope to prepare the site in the hopes that we can raise the remaining portion of the funds as soon as possible.

New Camp Projects Underway!

Two major projects will be funded. The first is to upgrade the playground equipment and the second is to begin upgrading the electrical around camp. As funds are collected, upgrades will begin. It was decided that both projects will be started off with seed money from the Bible Camp budget and funds will continue to be collected without end until both projects are complete.

Donations may be made specifically to these projects. Please designate where you would like your donations to be applied. Camp ministry, operations and maintenance continue to be of primary importance and will continue to be a separate fund to which donations may be allocated.
