In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' "
Acts 20:35 (ESV)

Paul is talking to the church leaders in Ephesus. He has just reminded them of his work to not be a burden to those who were new to faith or being introduced to Christ. He worked hard to make sure that there was no stumbling block to faith for those whom he was trying to reach with the gospel. He gave of himself to the point of death a number of times. What a great witness to the gospel!

Paul asks us in this passage to enter into the same spirit – to put ourselves out there for the sake of the weak. It is a servant attitude that he picks up from Christ Himself. Everything done for the sake of the other, especially those who are weak. How are <u>you</u> serving the weak?

I know that I often put my own needs in front of those around me. I need the grace of God not just to have the strength to give up on my own desires for the sake of others, but even just being able to think of them in the moment. Too often I fret because I missed an opportunity to share the love of Jesus, simply because I was too focused on myself. I get tunnel vision and do not notice those around me. I need Jesus to help me see beyond myself to the needs of others. I also need His grace to grant me enough faith to trust that He is looking after me so that I am free from looking to my own needs and turn away from that to the needs of others.

Never have I been so blessed with such a great learning opportunity as I am now. With all our Covid-19 fears running rampant and causing a lot of chaos, now is the time to train my thought patterns to be focused on others. Look to the weak, those who are physically vulnerable or those whose faith is weak and love them by meeting them where they are at. Even if I believe that it doesn't matter if I live or die, they might not be there yet themselves. Bend down, pick up the mask, sanitize the hands for the thousandth time and love.

God give us strength and courage to love even as He loves us.

## **Attention: Long-Distance Campers Include Your Voice at Camp!**



Previously, only members of the "charter churches" of the Elbow Lutheran Bible Camp (ELBC) have been eligible to vote at general meetings and to hold positions on the Board. The charter churches are:

⊕ Bethel Lutheran, Elbow

- Bethlehem Lutheran. Hawarden
- ⊕ Skudesnes Lutheran, Loreburn
- ⊕ Bethlehem Lutheran, Outlook

There has been a desire among the ELBC Board members to make some changes to the existing constitution and bylaws. These changes enable "long-distance" campers to:

- 1. Have voting rights at all general meetings, and
- 2. Provide for up to four Directors to be elected to the Camp Board with full voting privileges from the floor as numbers and interest grow.

The constitution / bylaws now allow "electronic" participation in meetings to make longdistance attendance practical.
