Hope Against Hope

I'm struck at all the times in the Bible when we thought the story was over. We could think of Noah and the flood, Joseph in prison, Israel on the beaches of the Red Sea, the walls of Jericho, Gideon in the winepress, Daniel in the lion's den, Jonah in the fish . . . this list can go on.

We have the luxury of knowing the rest of the story but the people in these moments didn't have that! David had five smooth stones and faith. Shadrach, Meschach, and Abednego faced a fiery furnace and said, "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

In many ways, individuals God used often found themselves in impossible situations. They faced moments that required more than just positive thinking. It feels like sometimes we chalk faith up to having the best plan or the wisest strategy. That's like Shadrach, Meschach, and Abednego praying, "Lord, show me the right way to enter this fire that will leave me unburned!" As if there is anyway that could happen!

I think one of the reasons we experience so much stress and anxiety in our world is that we are asking God to show us how to do something that only He can do. It reminds me of the disciples when they were trying to heal the boy with the spirit while Peter, James, John, and Jesus were upon the mountain (Mark 9). I can envision the disciples trying all the different strategies and techniques of healing that Jesus had done before. I can see their frustration and disappointment when nothing they're doing seems to be working.

We don't learn how to walk on water. We have faith in the one who holds us up.

Perhaps you're facing something that feels completely overwhelming or even impossible. You have tried all the different strategies and asked for all the

wisdom. Perhaps, like Peter, you've been fishing all night and have nothing to show for it. It is in these moments that we must remember Jesus' compassionate reminder, "I am the vine and you are the branches . . . apart from me you can do nothing."

In case after case of the events that we see in scripture, it was God who parted the seas, knocked down the walls, knocked down the walls, and killed the giant. The people of God acknowledged that if God didn't act - there was no other way.

Romans says of Abraham, "In hope he believed against hope . . ." It went against all logic, all optimism, all possibilities. This wasn't about finding some special way that he hadn't thought of before - it is about God making a way when there is no way.

That is our hope. When we think it is the end, when we think it is impossible, when we think the story is over - God makes a way when there is no way. It is why we pray, "Come, Lord Jesus." Because His intervention is our hope against hope.

Here are some areas where we need **YOUR** help:










Thank you for your faithful service in the ministry these many years! We wish you many blessings in your retirement!

We were thrilled to be part of “Experience Easter,” a drive-thru event we launched in conjunction with LCBI (Lutheran Collegiate Bible Institute), Outlook Alliance Church, and Our Saviour’s Lutheran Church. Close to 120 vehicles drove through eight scenes as the people listened to narration and music telling the story of Jesus. More than 80 people were involved as costumed characters, ushers and helpers and they did a great job sharing the Gospel in a creative and safe way. Our congregation sent a team of volunteers to Southend, Saskatchewan a couple of summers ago to be part of a LAMP Vacation Bible School program in the community. (“LAMP” stands for “Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots. See their website at www.lampministry.org.) Unfortunately we weren’t able to return last summer due to COVID and we have been informed we will be unable to go this summer as well. We are working hard to continue building relationships with the community from a distance. Two of the women on the team from our church created bags for the ladies in Southend containing devotional books, tea, lotions and more. We pray these gift bags will bring some joy and encouragement to the ladies in the community.

On April 17th, a small group of family gathered in the church while a large congregation joined online for the funeral of Harry Johnson. A few months ago (in October 2020), members of our church gathered under his balcony to sing for him on his 100th birthday. Blessed be his memory. He is home.

Our congregation marked its 110th anniversary during the worship service on May 16th. Pictures and video presentations reminded us of God's faithfulness over these many decades.




